

KEOSAUQUA SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING  
May 21, 2018 - 4:00 P.M.

Mayor Hesler called the meeting to order at 4:01 pm.

Motion Shipley, seconded Peacock to approve the agenda, Motion carried 5-0.

Public Forum: Deb Randolph, representing the Chamber of Commerce, discussed the need for the City to help support the local businesses. Jeremy Muntz addressed the council with his concerns of the City's clean-up at the Riverview Club and the use of funds, equipment and contractors by the City Superintendent. Korby Loeffler and Chris McEntee addressed the council regarding the Ferguson Sports Complex, their experiences at other complexes and the amount of revenue that can be created by hosting tournaments.

Motion Shipley, second Atwood to approve the closing of 5 parking spaces on Cass Street from Memorial Weekend thru August 31 for First Street Grille. Motion carried 4-1, Lazenby nay.

Motion Lazenby, second Peacock to approve the closing of Van Buren Street from First Street to the alley on Sunday May 27 from 5 pm to 1 am. Motion carried 5-0.

Atwood introduced ORDINANCE 163 – Amending Title I Chapter 3 – Civil Citations and placed it on its first reading for passage and approval. Shipley seconded. The first reading of Ordinance 163 was approved. Motion carried 5-0. Motion Shipley, second Harlan to waive the second reading and place Ordinance 163 on its final reading for passage and approval. Motion carried 5-0.

City Attorney Michael Craver addressed the council on the following items that his office has been working on for the city; Riverview Club/Van Buren Community Pool agreement, airport lease for new hangar, conflicts of interest and elected officials and employees, code enforcement, nuisance issues and abandoned and neglected properties.

City Administrator Padget updated the council on the leak at the pool and the work at the Sports Complex.

Motion Lazenby, seconded Shipley to adjourn at 5:17 pm. Motion carried 5-0.
